Exciting times at Moving On!

Our living skills and emotional resilience course goes from strength to strength.

We have been busy and the last 6 months seem to have flown by. We began to make sure the building was ready for our groups to start using again and at that time we decided it was the best opportunity for a really good tidy up. We threw away lots and lots of things and I mean lots!

It's been a very helpful process as the building now being less cluttered is a more ordered and calmer space for everyone. Many staff still work from home and we have also rented the green shed so we have lots of space.

We are busier than we have been for a long time. We have lots of new people starting and we manage the number of people attending by having a rota system so we don't over crowd the building and put people at risk. This system is working really well and we are able to have different people attending each week so it's a very fair way of making sure all who want to attend can.

Future Plans

We have been busy making funding bids for our new enterprise which will be called Môr. This project will be an arts based enterprise and we expect to base this in North Pembrokeshire on the coast.

The idea is that we gather design teams from around the county—PPF members who are keen on art and design. We will create designs and pictures. We can then work as a team to tweak the designs and then have them printed onto fabric or ceramics such as a vase. We hope to buy a kiln and make beautiful tiles too. We will have a website and a workshop and we will sell our items all over the uk.



We hope to have people from all over Pembrokeshire taking part and some of the art work can be done online or while walking with the group on the coast path. It's very exciting too because there will be an opportunity for some people to gain some work experience, job skills and even employment!

I hope Môr becomes a place where people feel they belong, a place where learning skills happens naturally and where we are all working as a team to create lovely items that people will treasure. This sounds like a huge project and it is! At PPF we know we have limited resources especially when it comes to money, but the best resource PPF has is its members and when the members get together we have everything we need to make something like Môr be a success!

Finally.

Going through Covid 19 has been tough, we have all faced significant challenges, staff and members alike. But there has been success too, we have all done so well in talking to one another, helping out, making sure others are okay and helping people find help and advice.

PPF's members have been a great example of how adaptable we all are, we can take on new and unexpected challenges because we pulled together, I often think of PPF as a community and during covid it's been just that.


been blown away by the amazing members.

News from the Dream Team


The Dream Team is a group of people with learning disabilities from 3 counties.


